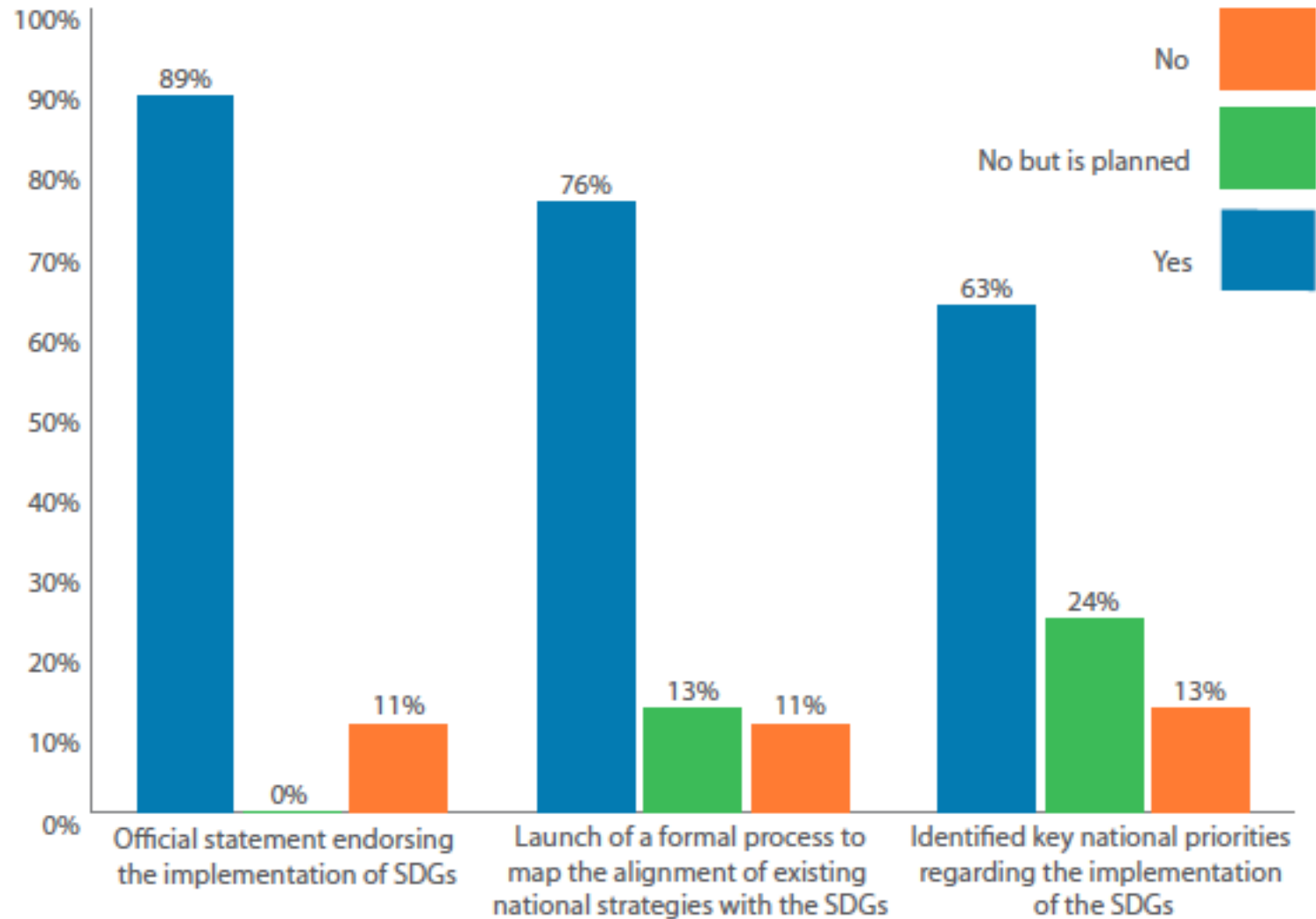
# REPORT BACKGROUND

- Global SDG Index and Dashboards Report published since 2016
- First Africa SDG Index & Dashboards report published July 2018 in partnership with the SDG Center for Africa
- 2019 Africa Report focuses on:
  - SDG implementation efforts in all 54 countries
  - 5 case studies on best practices on SDG implementation
- 2020 report on “leave no one behind” and the COVID-19 pandemic will be published in July

# Government implementation efforts

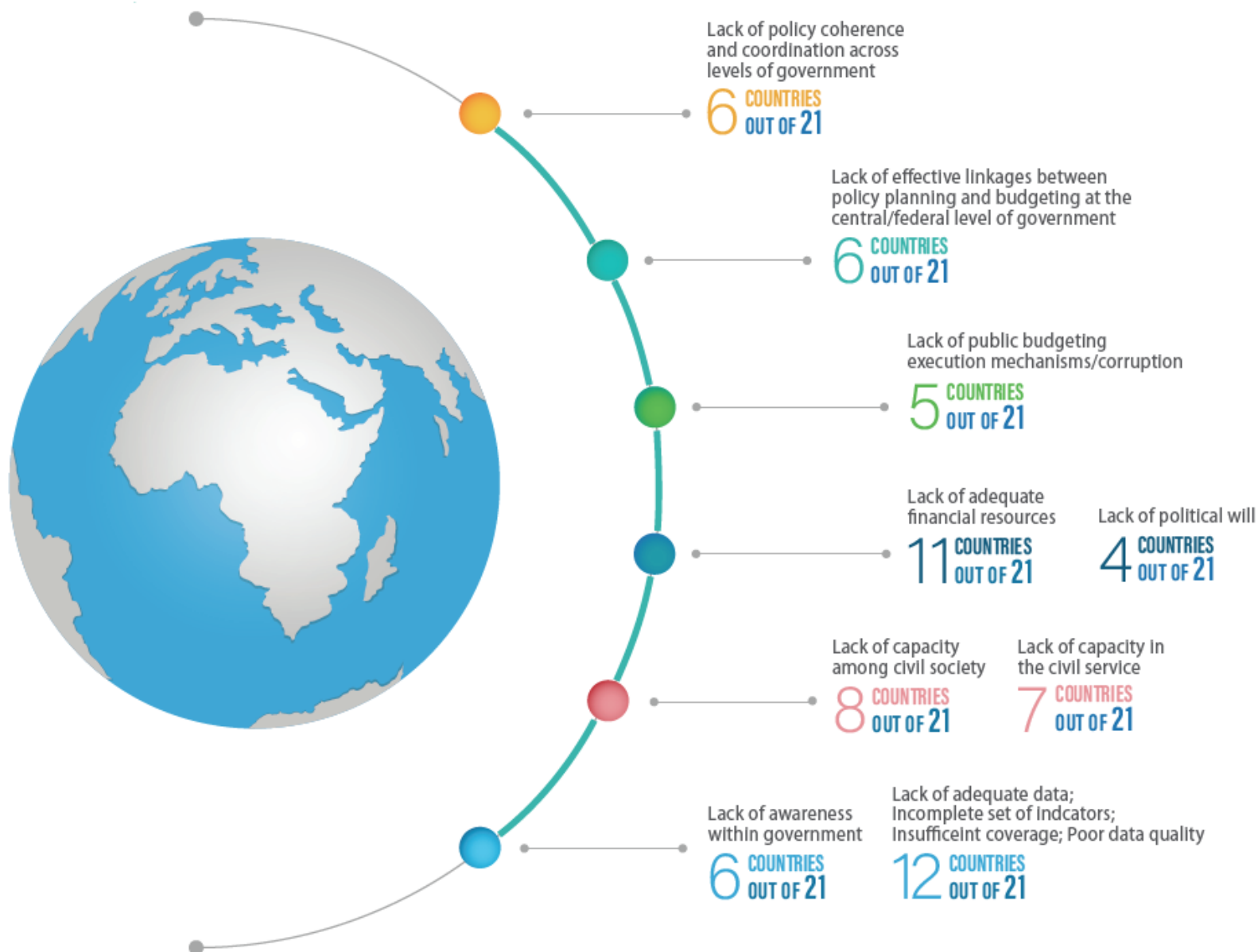
- ✓ SDGs have widely received official endorsements and have been incorporated into national strategies
- ✗ Lack of understanding on gaps and what it will take to reach the SDGs
- ✗ Very little consideration for the financial needs and funding
- ⚙ Stakeholder engagement can be significantly improved
- Lack of funding and resources is the single most significant challenge both in terms of SDG implementation and monitoring

# DATA SELECTION

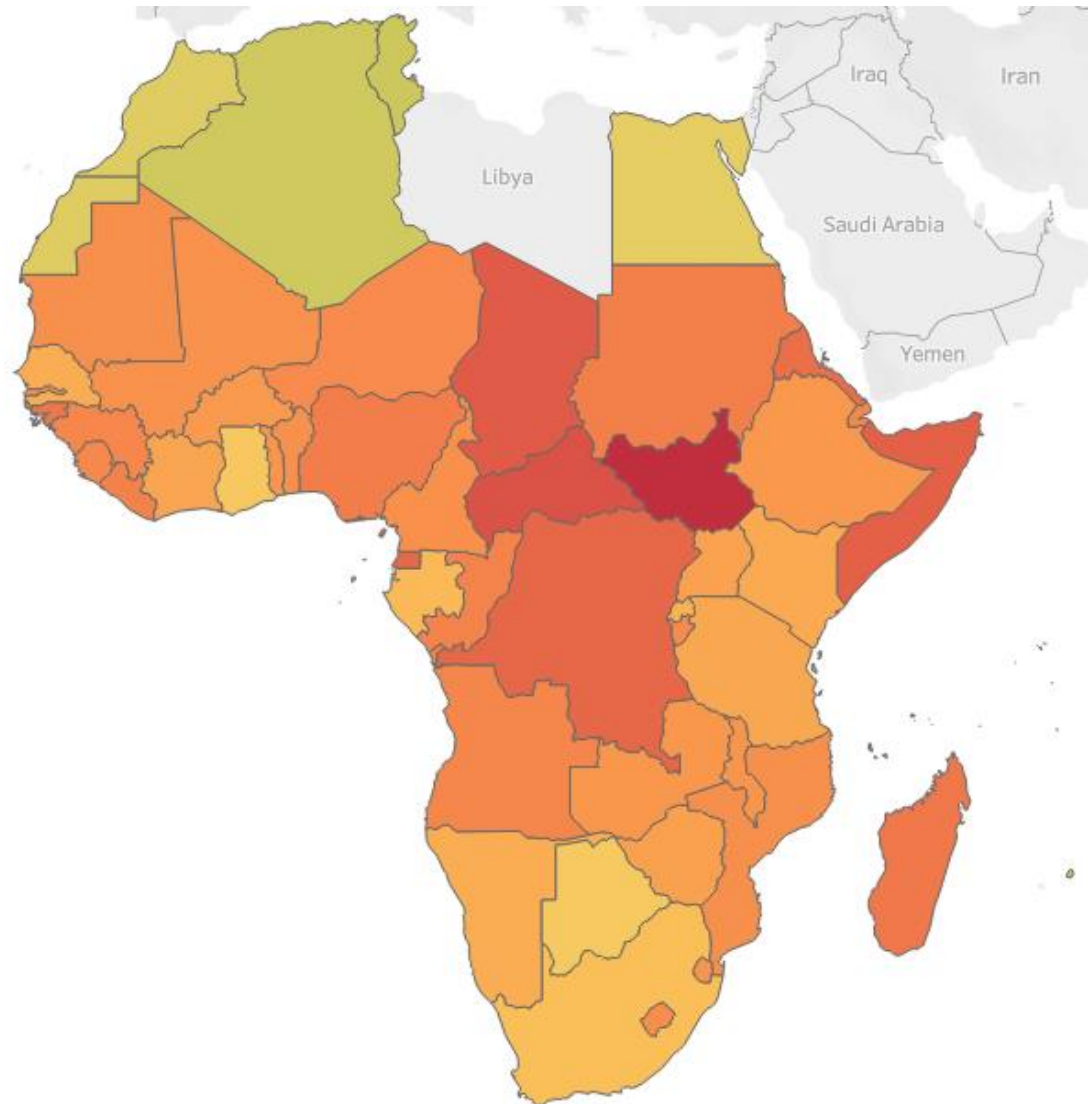
- 67 indicators retained from Global SDG Index Report, with adjusted thresholds
- 30 Africa-specific indicators
- Coverage criteria for new indicators
  - Data must be available for 80% of countries
- Sources
  - Official and non-official internationally harmonized data
  - International organizations, academia, research papers

# LIMITATIONS

- Insufficient data availability/coverage:
  - Libya and Seychelles excluded
  - Only 4 countries have complete data coverage
- Statistical capacity: much of the data are collected by international organizations
- Time lag: some data points are old (for example from a single HH survey) and won't be updated

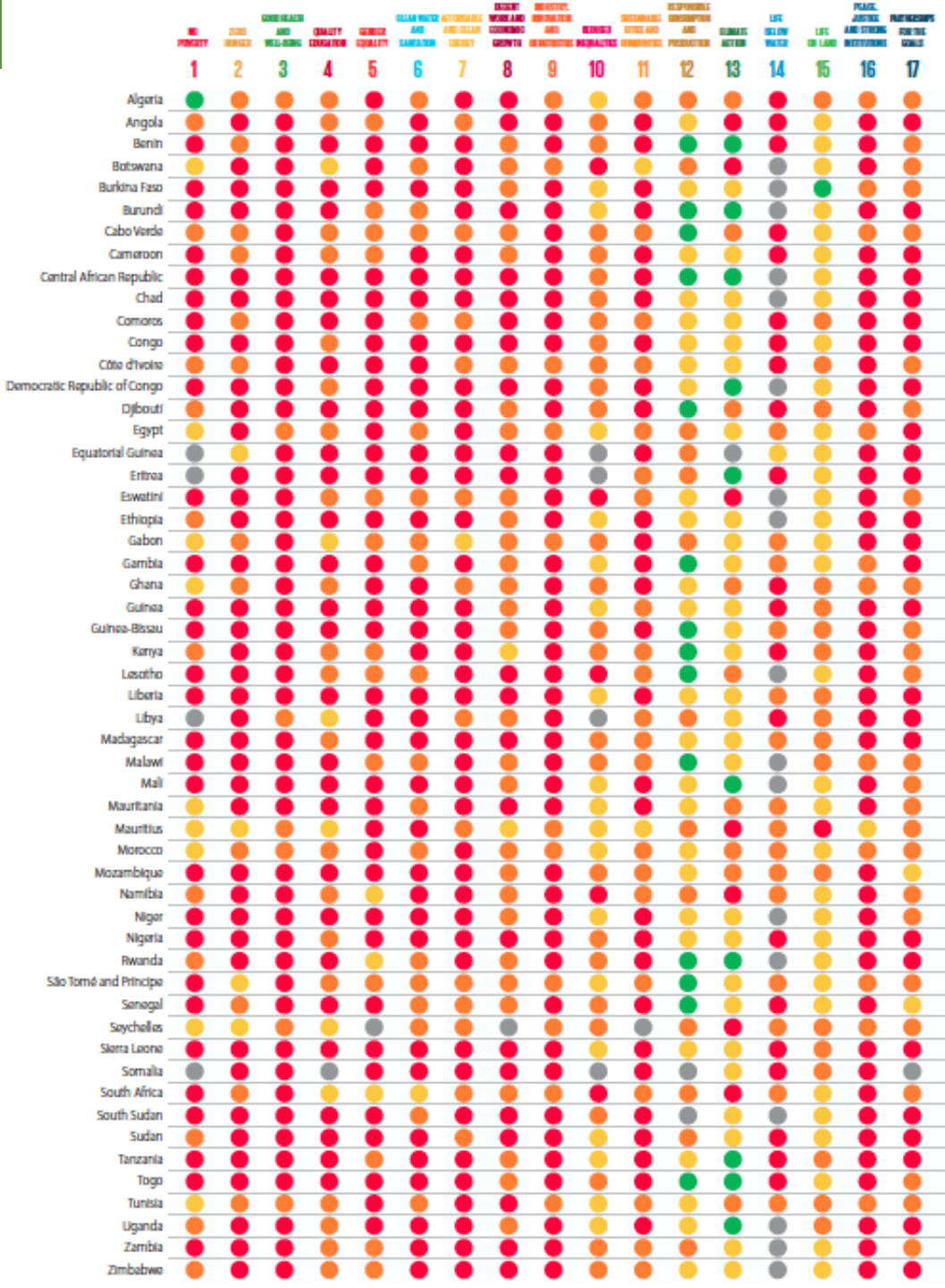

# AFRICA DASHBOARD

For 13 of the 17 goals, not a single African country has achieved "green," according to the Dashboard's system of color-coding



# TRENDS ANALYSIS

- 59 out of 97 indicators for which time series data are available
  - No time series for Goals 10 and 12
- Across all goals, the most frequently-observed trend is stagnation



**Decreasing**

Decreasing score, i.e. country is moving in the wrong direction



**Stagnating**

Score remains stagnant or is increasing at a rate below 50% of the growth rate needed to achieve the SDG by 2030



**Moderately Increasing**

Score is increasing at a rate above 50% of the required growth rate but below the rate needed to achieve the SDG by 2030



**On track or Maintaining SDG achievement**

Score is increasing at the rate needed to achieve the SDG by 2030 or performance has already exceeded SDG achievement threshold
